

Historical Highlights of Trauma Informed Care

National Efforts

1990s

- Substance Abuse Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA) hosts *Dare to Vision* conference and puts trauma in the spotlight
- *Women, Co-Occurring Disorders and Violence Study* funded to investigate services aimed at co-occurrence of trauma, mental health, and substance use (SAMHSA).
- *Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) Study* conducted by Kaiser Permanente and CDC brings national attention to the relationship between childhood adversity and adult outcomes (Felliti & Anda, 1998).
- National Association of State Mental Health Program Directors (NASMHPD) takes lead on issue of trauma.
- NASMHPD and National Technical Assistance Center (NTAC) create *Position Statement on Services and Supports to Trauma Survivors*

2000s

- National Child Traumatic Stress Network (NCTSN) resource for information and funding – established by SAMHSA (2001)
- *Using Trauma Theory to Design Service Systems*, seminal publication by Harris and Fallot (2001)
- National Center for TIC established by SAMHSA (2005)
- NASMHPD and National Technical Assistance Center (NTAC) sponsor trauma related manuscripts for mental health (Jennings, 2004), behavioral health (Blanch, 2003), child serving systems (Hodas, 2006) and organizations (Bloom, 2006)

In Oregon

- Addictions and Mental Health Division (as part of Dept. of Human Services) writes Oregon's first policy on trauma (2001)
- Children's System Advisory Committee (CSAC, advisory to Addiction and Mental Health) identifies the impact of trauma as a priority and includes it in their work plan (2012) – with a white paper to follow
- Oregon Health Authority – Addictions and Mental Health Division creates a TIC Policy based on the white paper and its recommendations (July, 2014)

Trauma Informed Oregon is initiated through the child mental health leadership of AMH and CSAC, and made possible by the vision of OR state legislators

(July 2014)

Trauma Informed Oregon is funded through Oregon Health Authority, and is a partnership between Portland State University, Oregon Health Sciences University and Oregon Pediatric Society.
