



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: An important role for TIC workgroups is generating and sustaining buy-in from the rest of the organization. Frequent dissemination of workgroup activities, priorities, and accomplishments can help, along with requests for input and feedback. Some workgroups also make a point of “noticing” and reporting on trauma informed practice they observe among their colleagues and providing additional information about trauma.
